

"You know Dom, the seminary is where you go to discern." Fr. Mark Searles

I was able to speak with newly ordained, Deacon Dominic Civitella, one of the six transitional deacons. Dea-

con Civitella has been assigned with us here at Sacred Heart/Holy Rosary for his final year of seminary. He was born in Easton, PA December 23, 1995. His 5th grade teacher joked with the class that when they are older and share the year they were born others will hear nineteen and think they are ancient. Unless of course, like me, you were also born in the 1900's. Dominic grew up in Easton and attended St. Jane de Chantel parish and school, and graduated from Notre Dame High School.

Dominic shared his thoughts that before graduating high school he didn't really know what he wanted to do, or if he even wanted to go to college. And like many other highschoolers college was the "next step". He loved English so at Slippery Rock he majored in English writing. After graduating he worked at Lowe's for eight months before entering the seminary.

I'm sure you are all thinking just like me. So, I asked. "What did Lowe's do to point you in this direction?" Surprising me, his answer was not Lowe's at all. But that at the end of his years of college he had a reversion to his faith. Even though after years of attending Catholic School he hadn't been truly practicing his faith. Dominic explained it was at this time he had both an intellectual and conversion of the heart. Realizing, yes Catholicism is true. And experiencing the grace of God after returning to confession, attending Mass again and praying the rosary. Dominic also revealed how seeing Fr. Ezaki celebrate Mass with such joy was instrumental in the awakening of feeling the Lord tugging at his heart to be a priest. Which he admitted, meeting with some resistance. Dominic had more questions than answers. And after receiving advice from a priest to pray every day to discern and desire the Lord's will, he couldn't deny the desire for priesthood kept growing. Fr. Mark Searles who was the vocations director at the time told him, "You know Dom, the seminary is where you go to discern." So he made the decision to go into the seminary, and as he says, "The Lord kept giving me the green light, praise be to God."

I see a great devotion in Dominic to Our Lady Mother of God. He gives much credit to her, and has great focus on the Marian dimension. As part of that focus and his work at the parish this summer he launched an adult catechesis, with Marian Mystery; Wednesday night from 7-8:00 P.M. Some other topics have included Prayer, Death & Judgement, Heaven & Hell. He will continue through August 13 with a very interesting series; Sin & Grace, Virtue & Vice, and Warfare of the Mind: Our Thoughts Determine Our Lives. This will continue to be on Wednesday night in the Wachter room from 7-8:00 P.M.

Pray for our seminarians as they begin the final year of formation in August, and God willing be ordained priest Saturday, June 6 2026.





Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, August 15

Holy Day of Obligation. Catholics and many other Christians celebrate the feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This significant feast day recalls the spiritual and physical departure of the mother of Jesus Christ from the earth, when both her soul and her body were taken into the presence of God.

Venerable Pope Pius XII confirmed this belief about the Virgin Mary as the perennial teaching of the Church when he defined it formally as a dogma of Catholic faith in 1950, invoking papal infallibility to proclaim, "that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."

August 22nd, Feast of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary

We celebrate an extraordinary coronation – not of an earthly monarch, but of a humble girl from Nazareth who became the Queen of Heaven and Earth.

This feast, closely linked to the Assumption (August 15th), paints a transcendent picture of Mary's journey. Tradition holds that at the end of her earthly life, Mary was taken body and soul into heaven – a prelude to her coronation as Queen of all creation.

Mary's royal title isn't mere flattery. It's rooted in ancient Hebrew tradition where the mother of the king held a position of unique honor and influence, as exemplified in <u>1</u> Kings 2:19 when King Solomon honors his mother Bathsheba by placing her on a throne at his right hand.
